Osprey Transportation and Safety By Peter Strauss

The Bay Street Extension is due to open in September. When it opens, Rivendell can expect to have an increase of thru traffic. As a community we need to be aware that this will have some obvious and some not so obvious results. There will be all kinds of traffic coming into our neighborhoods 24/7 that at this point is not measurable. One thing we can be sure of: with the new developments planned East of us, traffic will only increase over time.

Recently five members of COTS (Coalition for Osprey transportation Safety) met with Paula Wiggins, the Head Engineer of Sarasota County Transportation Planning. Our meeting lasted for about an hour and included people from Parks and Recreation and another engineer. What I took from the meeting was that the County has NO plans to physically improve Bay Street. Pedestrian and bicycle traffic will essentially share Bay Street as if it were a multi-use road/ bike trail/ sidewalk all in one. Sound crazy to you? Well this is the official position from the County. There's no money. It will be more dangerous than ever, and I would suggest not using Bay Street and risking life and limb while trying to go for a walk or

riding your bike. The county will paint shared lane markings (sharrow) on the road to inform road users in automobiles to share the same road with bike riders. Bike riders by law can use the entire lane (there is signage on Bay Street which posts this right now). Do you think this might create some road rage?

COTS has taken the stance that we must have some kind of multi-use path constructed, which, according to the County, will cost in excess of three million dollars. We will be petitioning the County Commissioners and contacting the press as well as the FDOT to hopefully make this happen.

On another subject, COTS has been talking to the County and FDOT about the increased development slated for Route 41 and Old Venice Road as well as the opening of Publix. The increase of traffic will surely affect our residents coming in and going out of our main entrance. The level of traffic, which now is near capacity, especially in season, must be addressed. COTS is working to find ways to make our roads as safe as possible: uniform speeds, more enforcement, and better planning for Osprey.

Documents Revision Committee Progress Report, June 2018 By Mike Bergman, as recorded by Steve Bragg

After months of updating and modernizing the Rivendell Documents, a meeting was set with our Attorney, Paul Olah. He complimented the accomplishments of our Committee and the Board. Sitting in for Rivendell were Committee members Joe Sefack, Steve Bragg, and Gary Mruz. Larry Dobias and Peter Strauss represented our Board. Mr. Olah noted that he has revised documents for many associations, and he is President of his homeowners' association in Lakewood Ranch. He agreed to a timeline that would enable the product to be available to our homeowners by the fall.

Paul Olah asked if the Board wanted to decrease the percentage of positive votes required for a quorum. Most of those present felt it would be in the best interest of the community to keep the 2/3 majority already in place. Joe Sefack asked Paul what major issues or problems might be presented. Paul replied that the State Legislature has watered down some of these rules and restrictions that had required compliance:

- · Vehicle/parking restrictions, commercial vehicles.
- Sale or lease of properties. What is enforceable? The State has revisions to Regulation 720.
- The fining process. Some liens may not be enforceable.
- Clean up definitions of land and ownership. Only references will be Owners and Lots.

When the legal work is finished, the proposals will be disseminated to the homeowners for their input.

Hurricane Embedded Screws Submitted by Rev Voth in June 2014

Does your hurricane protection include embedded screws that hold a storm panel or curtain and/or its track in place? These are most commonly found on the deck of your lanai and/or up the concrete wall.

When was the last time you actually tried to take those screws out? Many may have seized up over the years and were VERY difficult or impossible, to remove. When the decision to put up the shutters and curtain is made, the LAST thing you need is to be unable to remove the screws to install your protection. Instant panic!

Solution: Permatex Anti-Seize Lubricant is an industrial strength lubricant that prevents things such as bolts from seizing up over time when exposed to extreme conditions. The item number is 80078, and the product comes in a gray plastic 8 oz. jar with a brush attached to the lid. Just coat the threads of the screws and reinstall them. Be ready for the next time you need to install storm tracks and curtains.

Frequently Asked Questions: By Pam Babbitt

Question 1: We would like to repaint our home. Where can I find the list and binder for the "Rivendell Suggested Paint Color Palette?"

Answer 1: A pre-approved **list** of the paint colors is in the ARC Guidelines. Go to the Rivendell website, www.rivendell-community.com and select the Documents Tab, scroll down to ARC Guidelines and Forms.

Binders with sample paint schemes are available for loan from Lighthouse Management or from the Sherwin Williams store located at 4871 S. Tamiami Trail, Sarasota, (941-924-1174).

- If you use Sherwin-Williams paint, be sure to obtain the discount offered to Rivendell residents.
- Other colors and/or manufacturers may be used, but the homeowner must then use the usual process set forth in Section D of the ARC Guidelines and must include paint samples with their request.
- Homeowners may suggest additional colors and manufacturers for inclusion into the list. Suggestions must include the manufacturer's name, product number, name, paint samples, and suggested application, i.e. Body, Trim or Accent.

Machine Learning for Hearing Aids

Recently, we went to one of our favorite restaurants. This time the server remembered us and asked how we were. It was nice to have the staff notice us and recall our previous visits. It made me think of movies when someone walks into a restaurant and the waiter asks, "Just your usual?"
