Highlights of Annual Meeting

Overview of the year presented by the president, Ray Capuano.

Election Results:

There were no nominations from the floor. The ballots were counted, and three Board members were elected. They are John Fitzgibbon, Linda Rei, and Peter Strauss. The rollover of funds was approved.

Treasurer's Report: (Larry Dobias)

In 2017, we spent \$321,000 in operating funds and \$39,000 from our reserves. The reserves were spent on the playground, a well, irrigation pump and pool pump. Our bad debt from 8 houses is \$12,000, which is in collection. This is an improvement over the previous year. We have \$34,246 in rollover funds available for 2018.

Maintenance Committee: (Scott Christie)

Accomplishments in 2017 were the playground, park clean-up, painted lampposts, new flowerbeds in the islands, and trees trimmed.

Plans for 2018 are the complete renovation of the pool area to include the pump room, restrooms, pool, deck, and

Just prior to the January 17, 2018 Sarasota County Board Meeting, Palmer Ranch Holdings requested that the hearing on their petition to amend the Comprehensive Plan Amendment 2017-A, Addition to Future Thoroughfare Plan, which

Approval of 2/3 of all homeowners will be needed. Topics of particular concern are truck parking and a rental policy. The target date for completion is the 2019 Annual Meeting.

Bay Street Overpass: (John Fitzgibbon)

Palmer Ranch Holdings wants to further extend Bay Street by building an overpass over I-75, which would connect to a large development they want to build plus a new north/south road east of I-75. The County Commissioners will hold a hearing on this request on March 14 at 1:30 PM. Homeowners are urged to attend to express their opposition to the plan.

Architectural Review Committee: (Maureen Emmons)

Three new members were appointed to the ARC. They are Richard Jurik, Susan Lanza, and Dorie Bourke.

New Business:

Trim community palms: Up to \$3,100 approved at \$18 per tree

Replace dead grass on the bridge: \$450 approved

- New lights are going in on Crane Pond and an electric box replaced on Rivendell Blvd. Pergolas will be removed.
- Pool renovations will begin in March. The project will take about 2 months to complete.

would call for the construction of an overpass to I-75 at Bay Street, be postponed

This is the second time that Palmer Ranch has requested a last minute postponement after local residents became aware of how the proposed amendment could adversely affect our well-being, not only financially by influencing our property values and tax liabilities, but also physically by the increased level of traffic flow along the existing sections of Bay street and increased noise.

Even though Palmer Ranch Holdings was requesting an extension of the hearing on their petition, the County Commissioners were obligated to conduct a formal meeting in order to approve the request.

The Commissioners also opened the floor for public comment. Mr. Peter Strauss spoke on behalf of Rivendell and expressed our opposition to the petition and desire for traffic safety improvements to all of Bay Street. Ms. Sandy Keith, representing Lighthouse Property Management, expressed similar concerns. Commissioner Detert cautioned the audience that any public testimony given at the January Commissioners meeting could be used by Palmer Ranch when they are strategizing their testimony for the rescheduled hearing on March 14. After this, there were no other speakers from the public.

The official Hearing has been rescheduled for the afternoon of March 14, 2018 at 1:30 PM, at the Sarasota County Administration Center, 1660 Ringling Blvd., Sarasota. (North - First Floor/Chambers)

We extend our thanks to all of our neighbors, who made the effort to join in our expression of opposition to the is petition, and hope that they will continue to participate when we resume our efforts to express the community's opposition to this petition at the Official Hearing before the County Commissioners. Maintenance Committee Report - January 2018

The MC continued the progress on the major initiatives begun in Quarter 4, 2017: the pool remodel, the park cleanups and the Rivendell Bridge revitalization. The next 3-4 months should be both significant and visually pleasing as these initiatives mature. And as always, the basic never-ending maintenance of the community's aged infrastructure (irrigation, lighting, electric grid, lake overflow structures, landscape maintenance/replacement, etc.) continues unabated.

The pool remodel has begun (removal of the existing wood pergola) and should pick up steam in late February and early March as ordered materials arrive. The pool remodel should take a couple of months, so for planning purposes, the pool is likely to be closed in March and April.

The park cleanups have begun and will accelerate over the next few months. The community palms are scheduled to be trimmed over the next month or so, and dead pine trees will likely be removed over the same time period. Beyond that, we are currently engaged with our vendors to map out the most cost-effective way to clean up Rivendell Park, and other parks, budget permitting.

The Rivendell Bridge revitalization is in the final stages of evaluation. The grand plan is to remove the existing Washingtonian Palms (9) and replace them with smaller palms to create an attractive canopy. Beyond that, we are considering

replacing/augmenting the existing shrubbery and resodding dead grass in the bridge area. Our budget is tight, so the planning activities are key to optimizing our spending.

I thought it might be useful to give community members a peek at one of our activities that is definitely off the radar, but nonetheless an obligation the community has in order to be in compliance with county regulations: the overflow structures that balance water levels between our lakes and the wetlands. Director Larry Tobias and I toured some of these large cement structures with Aquagenix, our consultants that deal with these issues. What an eye opener! While I've seen a few of the overflow structures (large cement structures with grates/spillways connecting our ponds with the wetlands), I had no idea of their importance to the community. A few of these structures were so overgrown with shrubs, trees, vines, etc., that it was nearly impossible to get close enough to view them. The good news is that our initial inspection, although limited, indicated that the overflow structures were not in as bad a shape as we had feared. But the fix, not done yet, is still being evaluated by Aquagenix. We should have better information in the next month or so.

Our February MC meeting should be pivotal towards achieving some/all of our near-term goals as plans get defined and budget considerations become known.

Guard Your Social Security Number Excerpted from AARP Bulletin September 2017

1. Leave your Social Security card at home, along with your Medicare Card (unless seeing a health care provider for the first time). If you want to carry your Medicare Card or Social Security card, then make a photocopy with several of the digits blanked out.

2. When asked, don't tell. Organizations with the legal right to your number are: employer, banks and lenders, investment funds, the IRS, and government-funded programs such as workers' compensation.

3. Guard the Final Four: The last four digits are the most important to protect. Don't use the last four as a PIN, don't share them in emails, and ask companies to use an alternative identifier.

4. Freeze them out: Place a security freeze on your files at the three big credit rating agencies (although this may be too late for Equifax). To place a freeze, contact Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion. Freezes can be undone when needed for a loan, switching insurance companies, etc.

5. Quickly report it if your number is used for identity theft:

- Federal Trade Commission at 877-438-4339 or at identitytheft.gov
- File a police report
- Notify credit reporting bureaus and banks
- Notify Medicare, IRS, and Social Security


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Florida Sea Turtles

Five species of Sea Turtles inhabit Florida's waters though only three species nest on Florida's beaches. Florida is one of the largest nesting areas in the world for Sea Turtles. Nesting season is from March 1 thru October 31st. When visiting Florida beaches during this time it is likely that you will see areas marked or roped off where a sea turtle nest is (as they are protected by the Florida State Statutes, Chapter 370.12). And most beaches where they nest have a "lights out" policy after a specified time to prevent the sea turtles from going toward the lights.

Sea turtles can lay several nests in one season, in each nest laying approximately 100 eggs. The female covers the eggs with sand and then leaves the eggs to incubate for 2 months. The temperature of the nest actually determines the sex of the turtles. When the eggs hatch, the hatchlings race toward the water. A very small percentage of the hatchlings ever survive and live to adulthood. The females who do always return to nest on the same beach where they hatched.
